VOLUNTEER PILOTS AID IN SAVING LIVES

In January 1984, several pilots in the Phoenix area, along with the National Executive Director of the American Medical Support Flight Team (AMSFT), formed a new AMSFT Chapter in Phoenix. The purpose of this chapter was to eliminate two very serious health care problems which had plagued the Southwest for many years:

The first problem addressed was the shipment of blood and blood products to small and/or remote medical facilities throughout the area serviced by Arizona Blood Services (ABS) [now United Blood Services (UBS)]. The obvious solution to this problem was the light airplane. A small airplane is capable of taking off and landing at smaller airports located near those communities. In addition, these airplanes move quickly over Arizona's varied terrain.

The second problem addressed was that of blood shortages. Early receipt by the laboratory of freshly-drawn blood for processing allows for the optimum use of the most blood components.

FLIGHTS FOR LIFE, INC. missions are flown by volunteer pilots. These missions are flown, and the services of the pilots and aircraft are provided, at no cost to the beneficiary; they are done solely to enhance the good and welfare of the community.

No compensation, remuneration, or profit is anticipated or received by pilots of FLIGHTS FOR LIFE, INC.
